Cllr M. J. Crowe (Chairman of the Parish Council) welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced Peter Young who would be acting as locum clerk.

2. Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting held on 25 May 2016

No minutes were available for that meeting.

3. Matters arising from the Minutes

In the absence of Minutes there were no matters arising from the Minutes.

4. Chairman's Report 2016/17

Councillor John Crowe reported that this had been a very active year with several ongoing projects.

The Council had sponsored a very successful concert in December, and also provided financial support to the Village Hall and for churchyard maintenance.

Support for projects from the Community Pay-Back team had faltered due to the ill health of the supervisor and so the phone box project was temporarily delayed, but this was hoped to resume shortly.

The Council has continued with the Lengthsman work during the year, but funding for that from Staffordshire County Council Highways had now ceased.

Grass cutting had also been undertaken, and this continued to be funded by Staffordshire County Council Highways.

The parish had been awarded a "highly commended" in the Best Kept Village Competition 2016, and would be entering the 2017 competition.
